Help care for Lake Weyba west

FRIENDS of Lake Weyba, are planning to form a community nature conservation bushcare group to undertake projects in the foreshore park bordering the western edge of Lake Weyba.

This popular parkland area at Weyba Downs contains a mixture of coastal vegetation and open grass areas. There is an existing dog off-leash area and the park is well utilised by locals and visitors for a variety of land and water-based activities including paddling, windsurfing and kitesurfing.

“The west Weyba bushcare group will complement the existing nature conservation activities of volunteers at

the northern end of Lake Weyba,” FoLW president Anita Brake said.

“The new group will initially focus on weed management programs and a general clean-up of the park.

“We would like to hear from the community regarding what other types of projects they would like to see happen in this area.”
